Sheryl Johnson Hurbi Simi Valley, CA (January 31, 1950 ? June 15, 2017) After a brave two-year battle with multiple myeloma, Sheryl was called home to be with our Lord on June 15, 2017. She attended Whitworth College in Spokane, Wash., graduating in 1972 with a degree in social science. While at Whitworth she met her future husband, Robert (Bob) Hurbi of Valley, Wash. Sheryl and Bob were married at Lake Tahoe in 1978, and settled in Simi Valley, Calif. She loved being a stay-at-home mom to her two "precious daughters," Melinda Helen and Mary Eileen.
