Jacqueline Ann Tuttle, 68, passed away at her home in Eagle River, Alaska, on Dec. 6, 2016. Jacqueline was born on Oct. 21, 1948, in Buffalo, N.Y., to Burwell "Jack" and Verdan "Cookie" Cookman.
